KANSAI JAPAN

The Kansai region is located in the centre of the Japanese islands, and is surrounded by the Pacific Ocean, the Seto Inland Sea, and the Sea of Japan.

KOBE

Kobe, a city surrounded by mountains and the sea, has fused Japanese and Western culture into a unique Kobe culture, since the opening of Kobe Port 150 years ago. Special features include Mt. Rokko, Arima-Onsen which is one of the Japan's oldest hot springs, a waterfront, and Japanese sake breweries supported by high-quality water. Also, gourmet foods such as Kobe beef and Kobe sweets are waiting for your arrival.

TAJIMA

The Tajima region, where the Forest events of WMG 2021 are located, is an area full of natural features such as mountains, rivers, waterfalls and the Sea of Japan. After your race, you can rejuvenate yourself at the hot springs and enjoy local food, which consists of seafood, Tajima beef, rice and vegetables cultivated in an environmentally friendly way.

3 Event Centre

The Event Centres will be in Kobe City for the sprint competition and Yabu City for the Forest competition. EC Kobe is easily accessible by public transport and EC Yabu is accessible by shuttle bus and car.

The WMG Sprint competition consists of a Qualification Race and a Final race. The WMG Forest competition consists of a Qualification Race, a Middle Distance Final Race and a Long Distance Final race. Sprint Final: Port Island, Kobe City

Port Island, where the Sprint Final Race will be held, was completed in 1981 as the world's largest artificial island at that time. The island includes a wharf port facility, international exchange facilities, commercial and business facilities, educational facilities and residential apartments.

Terrain consists of office blocks and an adjacent urban park. The area is flat because of how it was made, but there are some multilevel structures and a pedestrian bridge that crosses the main road.

Forest Qualification: Sugigasawa Kogen, Yabu City






Map: ISOM 2017 standard, scale 1:10000 and 1:7500, contour interval 5 m. Mapped 2021

The Forest Qualification Races will take place on the extensive Sugigasawa Kogen (plateau). This is situated between 750 and 850 metres above sea level. It consists of coniferous and broad-leaved forests, grasslands with some marsh, and extensive cultivated land. The flatter parts of the forest have good visibility and runnability with gentle undulations. However, there are fewer features than in the steeper areas. The grassland of "susuki" (Japanese pampas grass) is cut early in the spring and becomes runnable rough open land. In the cultivated land, which is out of bounds to orienteers, the famous radish, "Todoroki-daikon," is grown.

Middle Distance Final: Uwano Kogen, Kami Town

The Middle Distance Final will be held on the slopes of the Uwano Kogen which lies between 500m and 700m above sea level. The venue, the Uwano Highland Educational Centre, is busy with students throughout the year as it is surrounded by a rich natural learning environment. The terrain consists of broad-leaved natural forest and coniferous trees with a network of trails and forest roads. Visibility and runnability are mostly good, but in parts visibility is reduced once leaves appear on the trees. In the terrain, there is a Museum for Wood Culture, large grass fields, field athletic facilities and a campsite.

Long Distance Final: Mineyama Kogen, Kamikawa Town

The Mineyama Kogen is a large plateau in the shape of a basin that is located 900m above sea level and is surrounded by mountains for around 1,000-1,100 m.

In the broad-leaved forest zone of oak, there is fine detail including small water courses with marshes and scattered rocky areas. Runnability and visibility are good in most places as much undergrowth and low lying trees have been cleared by deer. A ski area opened in 2017 in the south part of the terrain.

The SPORTident punching system will be used. Touch free mode (Air+) will be activated in addition to classic SPORTident punching. Both classical SI- cards and SIAC cards can be used. These SI cards can be rented from the organizers.

9 Athlete Registration, Entries and Payment

Registration, including entries for all WMG 2021 events, can be done only via the WMG 2021 website https://wmg2021.jp/en/games/entry.html

Registration for WMG 2021 commenced on 13 May 2021 and will close on 28 February 2022.

= Those who reister by this date can participate in up to five disciplines of the WMG competition.

Registration for WMG 2021 to only participate in orienteering is disciplines is possible until 10 April 2022.

Entries become valid only after payment of the entry fee.

Payment of entry fees (including tax and handling fee) is based on Japanese yen (JPY).

12 Transport and Parking

For the Sprint Qualification and Final there will be no organized transport. Competitors are advised to use Kobe public transport to get there. Both Sprint Qualification and Final venues are easily and conveniently accessible by public transport. There will be no designated parking areas for Sprint competitions.

From Kobe to Tajima area, where the Forest competitions will be held, you can use the railway or a direct bus. The direct bus is free of charge.

For the Forest competitions area, there will be shuttle buses connecting the event centre, Railway stations, competition venues, and the main accommodation centres. A limited number of parking spaces will be available for Forest Races.

13 Clothing

Competitors can make their own choice of clothing and footwear. However, spiked shoes are not allowed for Sprint model, the Sprint Qualification and Sprint Final.

14 Child Care and Luggage Store

There is no childcare service, but a space for childcare is available. There will be a luggage storage service available.

15 Climate

In Japan, the rainy season lasts for about a month from the beginning of June in many regions. The event is held in the pleasant season before that.

Average temperature and rainfall for the last ten days in May over the past 8 years is 21.3 degrees Celsius (highest 25.2 / lowest 18.1) and 53.2 mm in Kobe. Those in Toyooka in Tajima are 19.3 degrees Celsius (highest 25.7 / lowest 14.4) and 55.1 mm, respectively.

16 Antidoping

The Games are subject to doping control based on the <u>World Anti-Doping Rules</u> and the <u>International Masters Games Association Rules</u>, and the anti-doping activities.

18 Insurance

Athletes participate in the WMG at their own risk. Travel insurance is recommended.

19 Travel to Kobe

Kansai International Airport is known as the gateway to Japan from overseas and is connected by direct flights from 30 countries. Kobe, located on the north side of Osaka Bay, is very accessible, with a limousine bus about 60 minutes from Kansai International Airport, and also from Tokyo, 2 hours 40 minutes by Shinkansen.

20 Accommodation

Kobe and the surrounding areas offer a wide variety of accommodation types, including high grade 5-star hotels, budget hotels, B&Bs, Japanese inns, and guest houses.

For the Forest events, the host areas Yabu City, Kami Town and Kamikawa Town offer accommodations. In addition, accommodations in Toyooka City and neighbouring towns are also available. They have a wide range of accommodations including luxury hotels, B & Bs, Japanese inns, guest houses, cottages, campsites, and hard floors with "tatami" mats. In this area you can enjoy traditional Japanese hospitality such as hot springs and local natural foods.
